## What part has service in OA played in my recovery?

While the OA tools, and particularly the 12 steps, got me on the road to recovery, I believe service is what keeps me on that road. I may be able to sustain some discipline on my own for a time, but most things require buddy support for me to keep on track. My sponsor helped me get started, but passing on the message through service has been most rewarding in program. Whether it is sponsoring someone, making outreach calls and email messages, showing up for meetings and sharing--whatever way I get out of myself to reach out to another just gives me more of a reprieve from my innate, overwhelming selfishness that got me into compulsive eating in the first place. My preoccupation with self led to selfish, self-centered thoughts, self-hatred, and selfish compulsive eating. The more I serve others, the less room for self--THAT is a good thing! My daily prayer is to surrender to God and leave my powerlessness at God's feet and pick up His Power to serve others. The more I think of others and how I can share with them, the happier I am. What better way to keep in recovery? Serving others is my goal.
